Time that 911 received call from caller. This is an option value you might be able to get from your dispatch.

Time that dispatch is notified by 911 that the incident exists. This is an optional value you get from your dispatch.

Time that unit received tone from dispatch alerting them to the incident. THIS ELEMENT IS **ESSENTIAL!** You must fill it out before you save or close a form. This becomes the date of the incident.

Time the responding unit is *on the road* to the incident. This is a mandatory element. **Mandatory.**

This is the time your **unit arrived on scene**. If you are an *ambulance* agency, it is the time your ambulance arrived**, if you are a *first response* agency, it is the time your first responder arrived. This is **mandatory**.

Time the unit *from the previous question* made patient contact. This measures if there is a delay between arriving on scene and arriving at patient.

Time the unit *left the scene*. This is **mandatory**.

Time the unit *arrived at the hospital or destination*. This is only **mandatory** if you indicate you are transporting the patient.

Time the unit is able to respond to another incident. This is **mandatory**.

Time the unit arrives back at the station.

If **YOUR EMS AGENCY sends a first responder (provider affiliated with your agency) to the scene before the ambulance, record the time that responder arrived at the scene Under the "Response" tab in the "Scene" panel.
