
Vermont's Population is Growing Older

One in three Rutland County residents are over the age of 60 (32% or 19,440 adults), making it the 6th oldest population in the state. Since 2001, Rutland County has experienced a decreasing youth and an increasing older adult population. An increasing older adult population creates new challenges and emerging health risks.

Removing Barriers to Support Healthy Aging

Age Strong VT is working to make sure all Vermonters can age well. There are health differences between age decades in Rutland County which should be considered

with age.

when planning institutional support for all older adults. The proportion of older adults living alone increases with age. Older adults who live alone are at higher risk for loneliness, injury from falls, and cognitive decline. Adults 80 years and older have a higher prevalence than adults 60-79 years old of not receiving the social and emotional support they need. About one-third of all older adults fell in the past year. Approximately 10% of adults 60-79 years old experience cognitive decline. Not seeing a healthcare provider or drinking alcohol at a risk level decreases across age groups.
