Green Mountain Recovery Community (GMRC) - VDH



Services Offered

The **Green Mountain Recovery Community (GMRC)** is a Vermont-based recovery housing model designed to:

- Provide a stable National Standard for Recovery Residences (NARR) Level III environment to facilitate recovery, particularly for justice-involved individuals.
- Provide integrated whole-person care to those who are seeking structured recovery support including: *
 - Co-occurring clinical substance use (SU) and mental health (MH) treatment services
 - Recovery services
 - Employment support services
 - Life skills support and training

Structure and Participants

- Populations of focus include:
 - People with substance use disorder (SUD)
 - People with co-occurring SU/MH
 - People who are justice involved
- Referrals will be generated from various sources, including the judicial system, Department of Corrections, residential treatment providers, community service agencies, and self-referrals.

Funding Need

FY27 Request: \$1.2M for start-up and initial operational costs of as many beds as possible. Estimated that this funding will allow VDH to support an additional 16 total beds.

Why GMRC?

In October 2025, VDH hosted community roundtable events to hear from individuals in Vermont. Participants in the community roundtables identified that the State of Vermont needs to expand Supports and Services across the full continuum. Attendees outlined that the State needed to expand capacity for recovery housing (including special populations). These vocalized gaps are supported by Recovery Residence data and transportation needs highlighted below:

Identified Gaps



Recovery shelter and recovery housing bed capacity (including special populations) in Vermont



Co-occurring substance use and mental health services, at all levels



Areas in Vermont lack access to Recovery
Residences; access is also exacerbated by gaps in
the transportation system

How GMRC addresses the gap:

GMRC provides recovery beds, particularly for justice-involved individuals

GMRC offers integrated whole-person care including cooccurring clinical substance use (SU) and mental health (MH) treatment services

GMRC seeks to fill unmet need with accessible recovery beds in appropriate locations in the State of Vermont


