School-Based Substance Use Prevention Services Grant RFP Questions and Responses

- Q1. I am looking to confirm the indirect cost. Could you please let me know if this is a federal grant? If so, we will use the 10% de minimis on the application.
 - a. Although the resulting grant(s) of this RFP will not be federally funded, the Division of Substance Use Programs (DSU) will honor the 15% federal de minimis rate in budgets.

As per the RFP, please be sure to include your organization's indirect rate (federally or state-negotiated percentage, or the 15% de minimis if allowable per <u>2 CFR 200.414</u>) in the budget proposal. Please note that state and local government, including school districts, are not eligible for the 15% de minimis rate.

- Q2. Can you provide a breakdown of the way each of the proposal scoring will be evaluated? From the RFP under the heading of "Proposal Scoring":
 - 1. Need, including data to support need (20 points total)
 - 2. Capacity (50 points total)
 - 3. Partnerships and Institutional Support (10 points total)
 - 4. Sustainability and Evaluation (20 points total)
 - a. The following criteria will be used to evaluate proposals under each main heading:
 - Required to Merit Review (0)
 - Applicant is LEA or community-based organization that will directly serve one or more schools not currently funded under the DSU-School Based Funding.
 - Applicant has submitted all required paperwork outlined in RFP.
 - Applicant identifies 1 point of contact for the grant oversight.
 - Applicant agrees that funding will be used to supplement, and not supplant, other funding sources.
 - Need (20)
 - Applicant demonstrates a need for services and includes data to support need.
 - Applicant identifies specific grades to be served, with rationale.
 - Capacity (50)
 - Applicant narrative section provides a plan with reasonable expectation of being completed in the funding period.
 - Applicant has submitted a budget with reasonable costs and explains any other funding sources for the work proposed.
 - Applicant's budget and narrative section are compatible.
 - If applying for full funding, applicant has included all required activities in plan.
 - If applying for partial funding, applicant has provided a clear plan for capacity building with measurable outputs. Proposed work relates to the required and optional activities outlined in RFP.

- Partnerships and Institutional Support (10)
 - Applicant has letters of agreement from any identified partners that would receive funding through this grant.
 - If applicant is a community-based organization, it has: 1) identified the school(s) it proposes to work with, 2) confirmed that the school(s) are not currently funded through the DSU School Substance Use Prevention Grant, and 3) provided a letter of agreement from the school(s).
 - Applicant demonstrates the proposed work is congruous with work already being done in the school(s), and there is support from the administration of the school(s) and/or LEA.
- Sustainability and Evaluation (20)
 - Applicant demonstrates the ability or commitment to support efforts beyond grant year.
 - Applicant provides information on how they will evaluate the effectiveness of the activities being implemented.
- Q3. We are wondering if the Student Assistance Professionals (SAP) and the work could be based in afterschool primarily...?
 - a. From the RFP, "The goal of this funding is to provide and enhance substance use prevention and early intervention services in Vermont schools" and is for school-based services. Afterschool work could be a component of the work done through this grant, but not the primary focus.
