# 2015 Vermont Census of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Summary Report



### **SUMMARY**

- 535 APRNs worked in Vermont in 2015, including: \*
  - 413 Nurse Practitioners
    - 35 Certified Nurse Specialists
    - 48 Certified Nurse Midwives
    - 42 Certified Nurse Anesthetists
- 90% (481) of the APRNs were female, 10% male.
- Ages ranged from 26 to 81, with a median of 53.

<sup>\*</sup> an APRN may hold licenses of more than one type

### PRIMARY CARE

52% (276) worked mainly in primary care, including:

- 27% (143) in adult/family/home health
- 13% (67) in women's health
- 5% (29) in pediatrics

There were 192.7 primary care Full Time Equivalents (FTEs)

- 30.8 per 100,000 population statewide

### SPECIALTY CARE

48% (259) worked mainly in specialty care, including:

- 11% (61) in mental health
- 8% (41) in anesthesia
- 6% (34) in acute / critical care

There were 193.8 specialty care Full Time Equivalents (FTEs)

- 31.0 per 100,000 population statewide

### SUMMARY (continued)


- 30% (83) of the APRNs in primary care, and 32%
   (82) of those in specialty care, are age 60 or older.
- 38% (202) have worked in Vermont less than 10 years, and 30% (163) have worked in Vermont 20 or more years.

### CHANGES OVER TIME: PRIMARY CARE

In 2015, as compared with the year 2002:


- APRNs in primary care increased from 224 to 276.
- APRNs in specialty care increased from 130 to 259.
- 31% of the APRNs are age 60 or more, as compared with only 6% in 2002.


# **Age Distribution**



The median age of all APRNs is 53


# Age Distribution Over Time: 2015 vs. 2002






APRNs are unevenly distributed around the state

# **Location of Training**








61% of primary care APRNs, and 63% of specialists, have worked as APRNs 10 years or more

## **Practice Setting**




### **Patient Care Hours Per Week**




Average hours per week: 29 in patient care, plus 8 hours in other activities
