

Industry and Occupation of Vermonters Who Died by Suicide, 2019 - 2020

January 2022

The data below includes suicide deaths among Vermont residents between the age of 16 to 64 with classifiable industry and occupation information.¹ Industry was classified by major group using the Standard Occupational Manual, 2018.² Occupation was classified by major group using the North American Industry Classification System Manual, 2017.³ Rates are expressed as per 100,000 Vermonters working in that specific industry or occupation.⁴,5
